OBJECTIVE:

In conjunction with the Gender Alliance of the South Sound's goals of support and education, a Scholarship Fund designed to recognize outstanding transgender students and promote their educational goals has been created. Opportunities for gender identity minorities are in short supply, and the need for positive role models acute. This fund is intended to celebrate the achievements of individuals with "gender identity" minority status. The amount of the award(s) will be determined by funds available at the time they are granted and shall be at least \$500.

SELECTION PROCESS:

A panel of community members will review the applications and make preliminary selections for finalists based on their collective judgment of each applicant's overall qualifications, as well as financial need. The selection panel may request interviews of the finalists. This scholarship is awarded to transgender individuals and is based on a combination of achievements in the areas of academic excellence, citizenship, leadership, extracurricular activities, and financial need.

New Grants Support Pierce County Nonprofits

Pride Foundation/Pierce County has just announced the five nonprofit agencies they will be supporting with \$9,150 in grants. These organizations were selected by local volunteers, who carefully weighed how to make the most significant impact for the greatest number of people in Pierce Countys LGBT community. The committee had received six applications for funding, totaling \$21,123 in requests.
